Close tracking of this group of pupils at least half-termly, to try to increase attendance to the average for the School and ensure no persistent lateness or absenteeism. This will involve extra insurance on vehicles used for this purpose. Taxis may be provided to ensure pupils attendance and punctuality improve where this has fallen below an acceptable level.
