Jotmans Hall Primary School's Remote Learning Expectations:

As remote learning is a new way of learning for pupils, staff and parents we have written down our expectations about how it should be delivered and accessed.



School will......

- Provide a mixture of recorded lessons, independent activities and other relevant tasks (e.g. on Spelling Shed, Time Tables Rockstars) to continue learning at home.
- Respond to completed tasks through Google Classroom/Tapestry.
- Provide differentiated work/alternative/additional tasks for pupils who have an EHCP in line with the child's individual requirements.
- Have weekly live Zoom sessions to allow teachers to check on progress and wellbeing.
- Contact pupils who do not log in to Zoom sessions to check on wellbeing.
- Offer additional support to children via the Google Classroom/Tapestry comment box if required.

Pupils will.....

- Access their work each day (Monday to Friday) on Google Classroom/Tapestry and complete the tasks set.
- Find a quiet place to join their Zoom sessions and have a pencil and paper to make notes. (An adult to be present in the room)
- Use the 'Raise the Hand' and Chat function to participate on group sessions.
- Remain on mute unless the teacher asks them to unmute.
- Use the chat stream function for learning ONLY, it is not a social media platform.
- Remember school expectations still apply always follow our E.R.I.C. values.

Parents/Carers will.....

- Ensure their child is completing their daily tasks, unless there is a genuine reason they are unable to.
- Let the school know if their child has any technical issues with accessing online learning during isolation.
- Report any absences including COVID 19 symptoms or positive test results for the child or someone within the household.
- If parents/carers do not wish their child to be seen on the live Zoom sessions, please speak to a member of staff.
- Ensure their child only uses the platforms for educational purposes.
- Monitor the use of devices for access of other online materials and apps. Keep up to date with the latest advice regarding eSafety from the NSPCC:
